Be responsible with your medication.

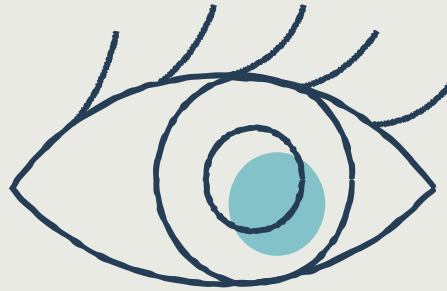
*47% of people who misused prescription pain relievers in the past year obtained the pain relievers from a friend or relative*

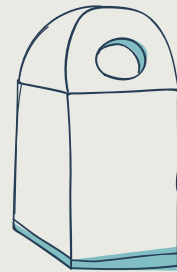
## Lock

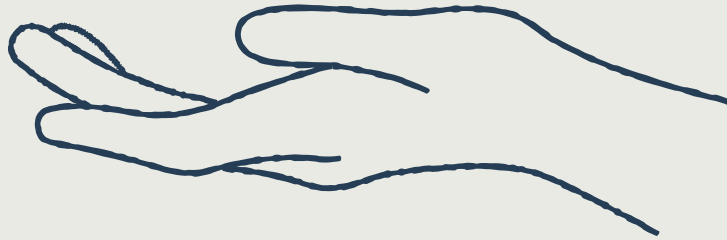
